

Memo-Zoo

Game type:	Look for picture pairs
Players:	2–4 children. Ages 3+
Contents:	36 picture tiles made of birch plywood (18 picture pairs), instructions
Illustrations:	H. and Ch. Wiechert

For the young beginners of this game it is helpful to first spread out all the tiles and look at the pictures of the animals and memorize their names. It would be helpful if an older person could help you with this, for example by calling out the names of the animals and letting you look for the corresponding tile.

Before you begin the game, shuffle all the tiles and spread them out face-down on the table or floor so that everyone can reach them. The youngest child begins.

When it's your turn, turn over any 2 tiles and see if you have a matching picture pair.

If you have two of the same animals, you get to keep them and pile them up in front of you. Then it's the next player's turn.

If you turn over 2 pictures that don't match, you must put them back in place face-down. Try to remember where they are. Now it's the next player's turn.

The player with the highest pile of matching pairs **wins**.
